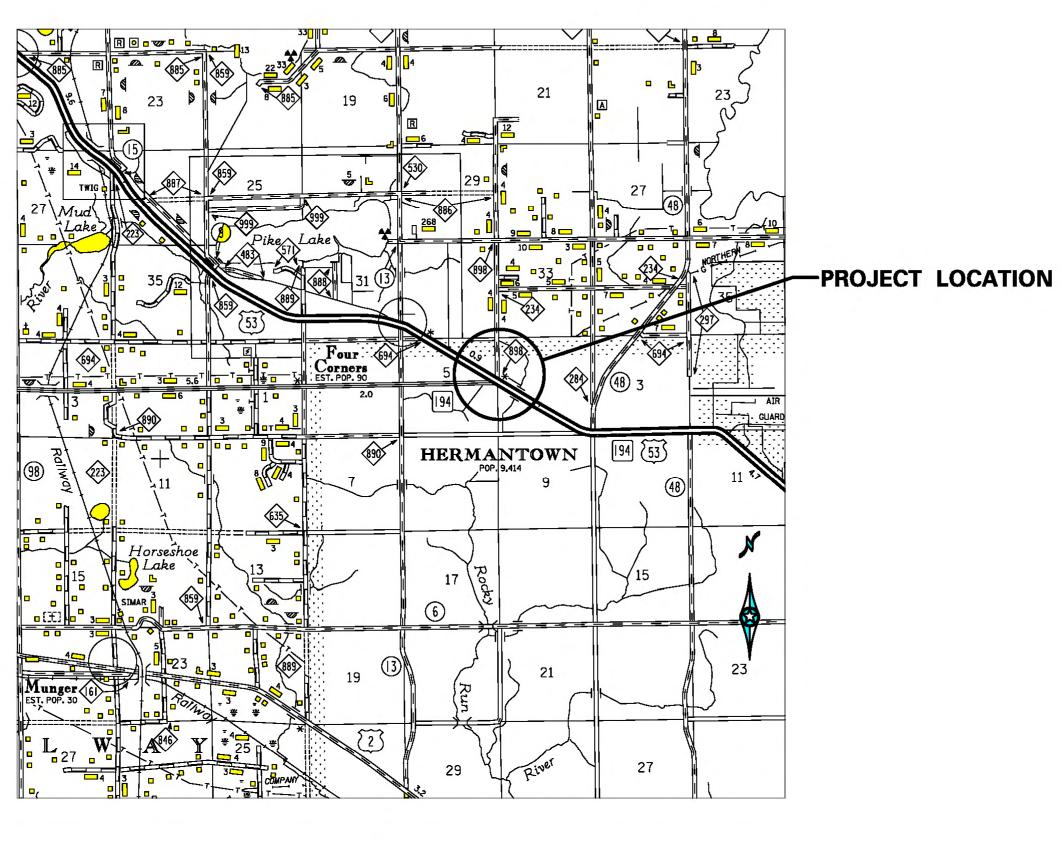

Purpose and Need

• An Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) will be prepared for the Hwy. 194 intersections with Hwy. 53 to determine the appropriate means to address safety and mobility. The appropriate intersection improvement will be included for construction as part of this project. Preliminary indications are a restricted crossing U-turn (RCUT) may be appropriate. Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds have been obtained for this intersection.

The goal of this ICE is to implement cost-effective safety improvements that can begin to address intersection deficiencies in the near- and long-term. Understanding the nature of the intersection safety problem and the need to address potential future traffic operations deficiencies, MnDOT and Saint Louis County desire an intersection improvement solution that accomplishes the following goals:

- Reduces the frequency of severe crashes; and
- Improves the intersection level of service into the future
- There are no design exceptions.

This is not a house moving route.

T.H. 53 is an OSOW Super Load Corridor. There are OSOW vehicles that do use T.H. 194.

The loon u-turn on the eastern side of the project needed to be moved further east to avoid sanitary structures and an automotive dealership.

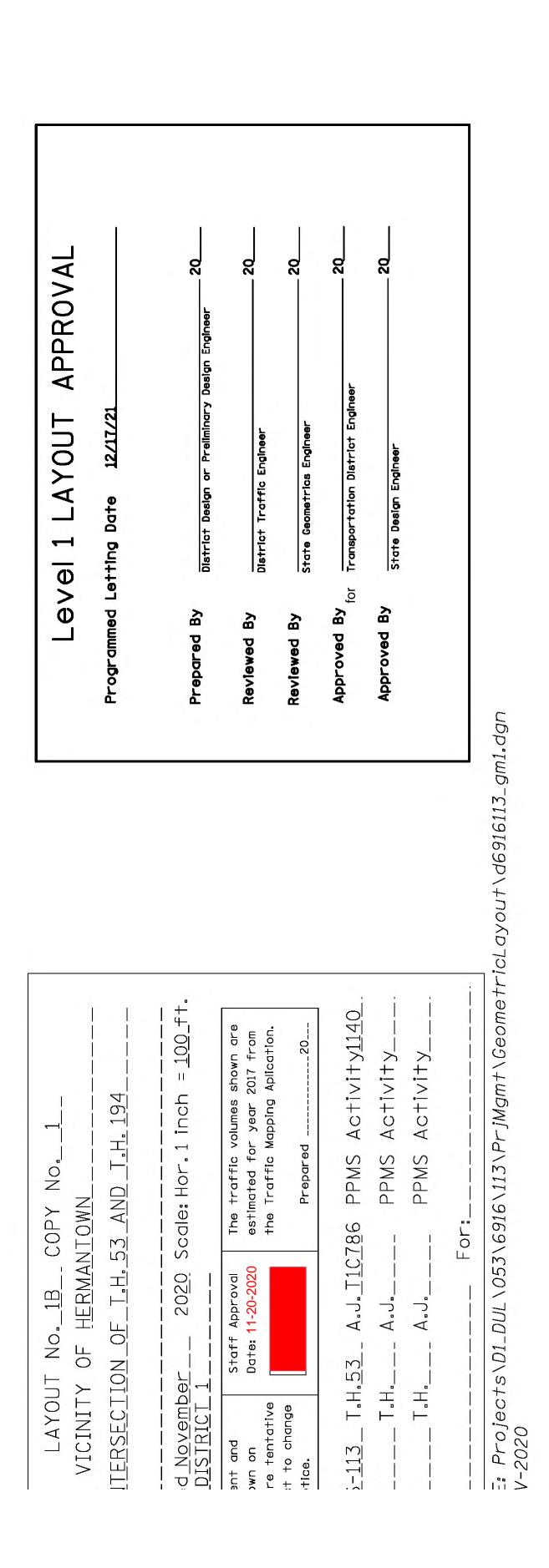

Subject: Water/Sewer Bill Analysis

Attn: John Mulder, City Administrator:

As we discussed, Hermantown has received some questions and complaints from customers regarding the increase in water and sewer bills in 2020. Dave Berg Consulting, LLC has undertaken an analysis of billings to customers in 2019 and 2020 for the months of May-Sept to evaluate the basis for these complaints from customers. Attached to this letter is a summary of my experience relative to this analysis.

Customer bills for utility services like water and sewer are dependent on two things, 1) the rates set by the utility and 2) the usage by the customer. Comparing the rates for 2019 and 2020 for water and sewer, the water rates were increased by 4% and the sewer rates were increased by 2.5%. If a customer's usage does not change from 2019 to 2020, they would experience a 4% increase in their water bill and a 2.5% increase in their sewer bill. This certainly represents an increase in bills, but it is unlikely that it is enough to warrant too many customer complaints.

Another feature of Hermantown's rates, like many water utilities, is the rate structure. The rates for residential and commercial water are called inverted or inclining rates. Under this type of structure, as a customer's usage increases, the rate increases. For residential customers, the first 2500 gallons cost \$7.84 per 1000 gallons, the next 2000 gallons cost \$9.02 per 1000 gallons and any usage over 4500 gallons cost \$9.92 per gallon. For sewer rate is a flat \$9.90 per 1000 gallons for all usage. If usage increases, the bill will increase at a faster rate than consumption due to the inverted rate for water as more usage is billed at the higher rates.

Exhibit 1 to this letter shows average usage and average commodity rates for water for commercial, irrigation, multi-family and residential customers for the months of May – Sept in 2019 and 2020. I will focus my analysis on the residential customers. The average water consumption per residential customer increased 9.3% in May, 23.7% in June, 56.3% in July and 19.3% in September when comparing 2020 to 2019. In August, the average usage was down slightly. Also, the average cost per 1000 gallons was significantly higher for residential customers in May, June, July, August and September. The average cost per 1000 gallons would have increased 4% due to the rate increase, the rest of the increase is due to customers consuming more water in the more expensive blocks within the tiered rate structure. For instance, in July the average usage was 3,582 gallons per residential customer in 2019 but

increased to 5,597 gallons per residential customer in 2020. This means the average residential customer used 1,097 gallons of water within the most expensive rate in July of 2020. Increased usage combined with an increased average rate has a compounded effect on the customer bill. In July 2020 the combination of a 56.3% increase is usage and a 9.2% increase in average rate results in an overall increase in the water bill of 71%. Additionally, the increased usage combined with a 2.5% sewer rate increase results in a 60% increase in the sewer portion of the bill. Customers did see significant increases in bills during the summer of 2020, but it is important to understand that those increases are mostly due to increased consumption.

Some customers have inquired if their meter may be defective and over-reading water usage. This is very unlikely. Water meters are highly accurate, and if a water meter is failing, they tend to slow down (read less water) and ultimately stop.

The reasons for increased usage likely revolve around the use of water for lawns and gardens due to drier weather combined with more individuals staying home due to COVID-19 restrictions and work from home policies. It is interesting to note that commercial average usage was actually down in May and June from 2019 to 2020. This is likely due to businesses closing and operating at lower levels during COVID-19 closures.

REQUESTED ACTION

No specific action at this time, but update and direction from the City Council

Background:

City staff has been discussing signage and access/security for the Munger Trail Spur project. This trail segment has three points where the trail crosses either a road or a parking drive lane where there will be interaction between vehicles and pedestrians. In addition, these points provide a bituminous surface which could be mistaken by vehicles as a driveway/driving surface.

Staff has prepared the attached document which proposes pedestrian and vehicle signage along the trail and public roadways/parking drive lanes. In addition, the graphics show the use of a swing gate at these access points in order to discourage motorized vehicles from entering the trail. The swing gates have been shared with the City's Police and Fire Departments, both of which are comfortable with the concept and their abilities to still access the trail in case of emergencies.

These signs, gates and crossing warnings will serve as the basis for future trail segments as well.

Staff is in the process of designing a formal signage plan which will locate the location and type of signage along the trail and roadways/parking lot drive lanes. This plan will be sent to the Utility Systems of America for pricing with the information then being presented to the City Council for their review and action.

REQUESTED ACTION Approve final CARES submittal to the State of Minnesota

BACKGROUND

Due to the current economic recession and COVID-19, the City was allocated \$733,136 of CARES dollars. This money came from the State of MN, which received it from the federal government. There was criteria of what it could be spent on and by when. The criteria evolved somewhat throughout the year. City staff spent quite a bit of time in webinars, doing research, talking to other Cities, and in conversations with the League of MN Cities in exercising due diligence to make sure it was properly spent.

The City made a conscious decision to first use some of the funds itself. Second, the City reached out to partners to help them with COVID necessary expenses. Finally, the City hoped the November 15th deadline to use the funds would be extended as the pandemic is much worse now then in the spring and summer. Unfortunately, this did not happen and the deadline was not extended. Per the CARES Act requirements, the City is obligated to return any unspent funds to St. Louis County.

As with any federal or state grants, there are stringent reporting requirements. This particular CARES Act was challenging in that the rules were initially somewhat gray and ever changing as the Act was passed quickly in response to the ongoing pandemic. Please see attached the final submittal to the State of Minnesota. Our accountant, Dana Cunningham, was instrumental in properly tracking and categorizing these funds the past months and did an outstanding job. It has been a big undertaking in addition to everything else 2020 has given us. The City and its partners have benefitted from these dollars which has been a bright spot in this challenging year.

In summary, of the \$733,136 received \$553,154.44 was spent. The balance of \$179,981.56 was returned to St. Louis County. I believe they do have a very short time frame in which to use those funds.

LEGAL BASIS FOR REPORT

This report is prepared pursuant to a Resolution approved by the Hermantown City Council calling for the preparation of a preliminary engineering report, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 429.031.

This report is prepared in accordance with said Section 429.031. Specifically, this report hereby advises the City Council, in a preliminary way, as to whether the proposed improvement is necessary, cost-effective and feasible and as to whether it should best be made as proposed or in connection with some other improvement.

This report also includes the estimated cost of the improvements as recommended.

The compensation paid to Northland Consulting Engineers, LLC for preparing this report is based on the following factors:

- 1. The time and labor required.
- 2. The experience and knowledge of the preparer.
- 3. The complexity and novelty of the problems involved.
- 4. The extent of the responsibilities assumed.

The compensation paid to Northland Consulting Engineers, LLC. for preparing this report is not based on a percentage of the estimated cost of the improvement.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to determine the impact to public & safety, cost effectiveness, and economic feasibility for reconstruction the public easement that connects Lavaque Road to Do North Pizza, approximately 300 FT west of Lavaque Road.

DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND

The Public Easement Driveway (unnamed) which runs from Lavaque Road to the west approximately 300 FT is in an advanced stage of deterioration. To properly connect Do North Pizza, Lakehead Oil (formerly BP), and Centricity Credit Union to Lavaque Road, the existing easement needs to be improved. Because of the advanced stage of deterioration, repairs to the pavement are not an option and complete reconstruction is required. Because of the future consideration for a frontage road that would run west connecting to AAD Shriners, there is consideration for extending the current easement to edge of Do North's property.

ANALYSIS

<u>Option 1 – Do Nothing</u>

Due to the deteriorating state of existing easement "Do Nothing" is not an acceptable option moving forward.

Option 2 - Reconstruct Existing Driveway Easement to Do North's Property

Option 2 would reconstruct the easement road in its current configuration, slightly widening the road to a City Standard 28', with curb & gutter. The east entrance to Lakehead Oil would be reconstructed while their west entrance would be closed. Centricity Credit Union would have both of their entrances off the easement reconstructed. Additionally, storm sewer would be added to promote proper drainage and strow water conveyance. Under Option 2 the easement driveway would be constructed entirely in the existing easement and terminated at Do North's east property line, approximately 300' from Lavaque Road ROW. An exhibit of Option 2 has been attached to this report.

Option 3 - Extend existing driveway easement to extend of Do North Property

There has been discussion amongst developers and the City to further extend the public easement as a frontage road to AAD Shriners. To accommodate this in the future, this phase would extent the easement the entire extents of Do North's property, approximately 115 FT. This would make extending the frontage road easier in the future. An exhibit showing Option 3 added to Option 2 has been attached to this report.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Because Option 1 is not an acceptable option to the City and Option 3 is only for future consideration, Option 2 has the only desirable outcome while keep the cost within reason. Attached is NCE's Engineer Estimate which puts the project at roughly \$237,000 including soft costs and contingencies. There are few alternatives to reduce costs on this project as this is already a limited scope road reconstruction.

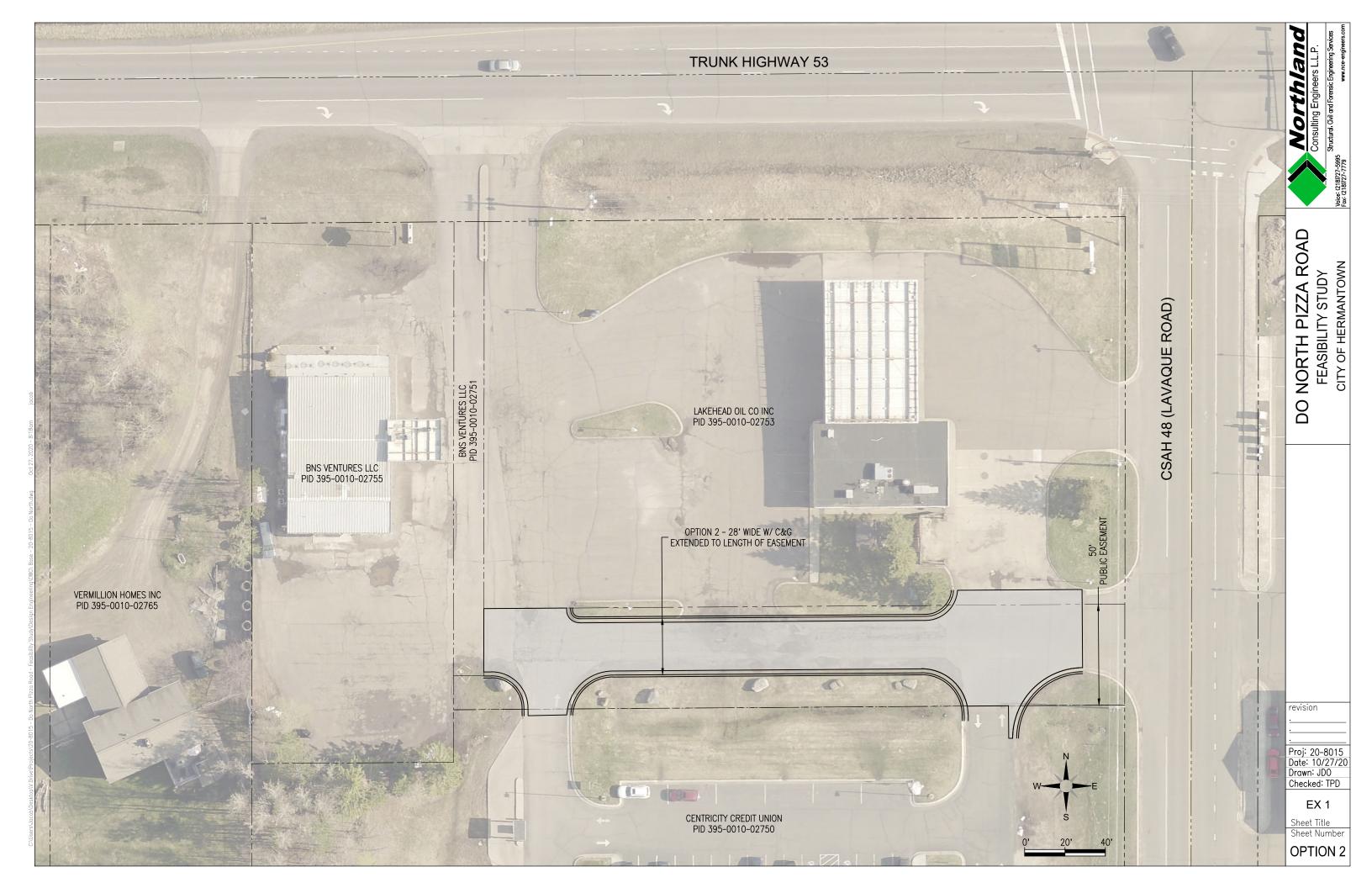

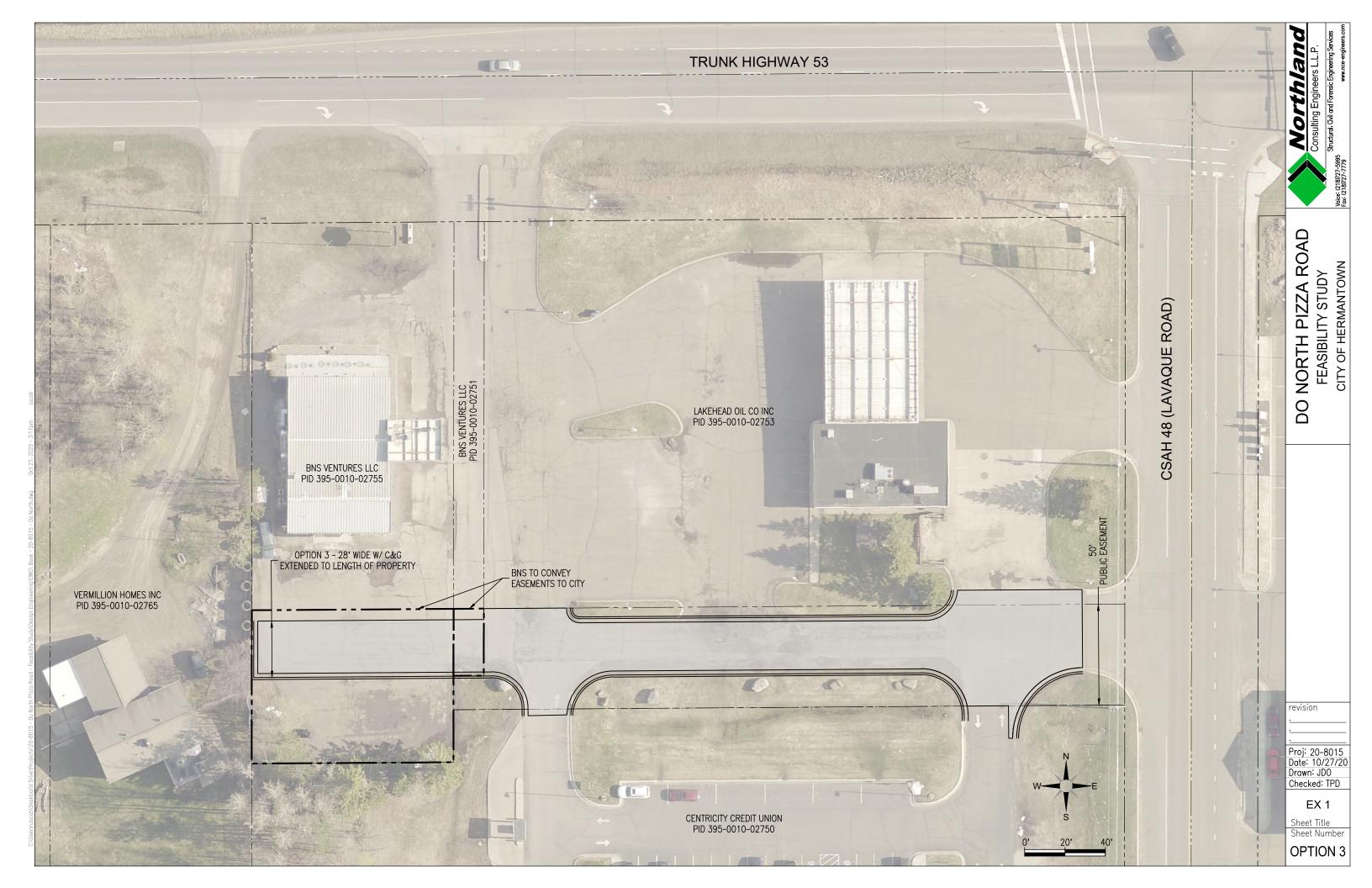

BACKGROUND

Earlier this year the City Council ordered the improvement to Sundby and Swan Lake Road as part of the 2021 Road Improvement Plan. The City entered into a cooperative agreement with St. Louis County to prepare the plan and specifications along with their plans to improve Stebner and Airbase Road.

The County has completed the plans and is now ready to advertise for bids. As part of the assessment process, the City Council needs to approve the plans and authorize the advertisement for bids.

The County needs to submit the plans to the State for approval because it is a Municipal State Aid (MSA) project. Once approved, the County will do the necessary advertising in January and bids will be due sometime in February. We have included excerpts from the plan set for your review. A complete plan set is on file in City Hall.

A brief summary: Swan Lake Road from Sundby to Haines Road, and Sundby Road from Swan Lake to Airbase Road will be reclaimed and overlaid. This means the existing bituminous will be milled and placed back and used as additional base. New pavement will then be placed on the improved road bed. The road design will meet our current city standards of 24 feet of pavement and 2-foot shoulders.

In addition, the bridge on Swan Lake Road will be removed and replaced with a box culvert. Currently the bridge is considerably narrower than the road. When completed the road will be the City standard of 24 feet of pavement.

David,

Attached is our revised schedule for the above referenced project. It is our intention to complete the installation of the trunk sewer to manhole 236 this year and to complete the final connection to the lift station next spring. The completion of the trail and the maintenance road will be next year when the weather conditions are more favorable. Because of the existing soils, it appears as though there will need to be a significant quantity of granular backfill hauled in from offsite to complete the maintenance road from manhole 225 to the lift station. We think this should be investigated before the maintenance road is constructed in this area.

For the following reasons, we are requesting that the substantial completion date be extended to July 31, 2021 and the final completion date be extended to August 31, 2021:

1. Late start resulting from the delayed USACOE permit approval. Because of the saturated soil and surface conditions from the spring thaw and the road restrictions it made it nearly impossible for us to get our pipe bedding aggregates in place. This was the worst possible time of the year to start the project. Our crew had to create some site drainage and we had to allow adequate time for the site to dry.

2. Delays resulting from the pandemic. From March until June the City was unable to perform the pre-condition surveys for blasting because of

the pandemic. Therefore, we could not complete the work as per our schedule in these areas and we had to move around and adjust our approach to the project.

3. Extra work related to the garbage we encountered between manholes 202 and 204.

4. Extra work to install a water main across Anderson Road.

5. Extra work to install an additional box culvert.

6. The engineer preferred to wait to pave the trail and maintenance road until next year.

Even though we had to overcome some obstacles at the beginning of the project, we have worked diligently to ensure that the project progressed in a positive direction. Thank you for your consideration in this matter.
