The area proposed to be assessed for such improvement is every piece and parcel of property benefited by such improvement, whether abutting thereon or not, based upon the benefits received by each piece and parcel.

The estimated cost of such improvement is \$3,656,243.80.

Proposed assessment: \$9,750.00 per parcel

RESOLUTION ORDERING IMPROVEMENT AND DIRECTING PREPARATION OF FINAL PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 534 (UGSTAD ROAD)

WHEREAS, the City Council has received and approved a preliminary engineering report for the project ("Project") known as Road Improvement District No. 534 (Ugstad Road); and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on the Project; and

WHEREAS, ten days' mailed notice and two weeks' published notice of the hearing was given, and the hearing was held on the 1st day of February, 2021 at which all persons desiring to be heard were given an opportunity to be heard thereon; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration the Council believes it is in the best interests of the City of Hermantown to proceed further with the Project; and

WHEREAS, the next step in the process is to prepare final plans and specifications for such project; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to proceed to prepare such plans and specifications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Hermantown, Minnesota, as follows:

- 1. Such improvement is necessary, cost-effective, and feasible as detailed in the feasibility report.
 - 2. Such improvement is hereby ordered as proposed.
- 3. The City Engineer is hereby authorized and directed to have a project engineer complete final plans and specifications in the project known as Road Improvement District No. 534 (Ugstad Road).
- 4. Upon completion of such final plans and specifications, the project engineer is requested to present them to the City Council for approval and authorization for bidding.
- 5. The City reasonably expects to finance the Project from an issue of tax-exempt bonds. In advance of issuance of the bonds it will be necessary for the City to temporarily finance certain costs of the Project by using either working capital or cash reserves, which are needed for other purposes. The City reasonably expects to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds within eighteen (18) months after the date the Project is paid from such working capital or cash reserves.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

- 1. City Engineer Services: In 2015, the City began hiring project engineers for projects over \$500,000 with some exceptions so the City Engineer would provide oversight of the engineer's work without any conflict about overseeing their won work. This created a second layer of engineering on those larger projects which added costs, but also provided an additional layer of protection and oversight to those projects. The Council discussed how the current City Engineer, Northland Consulting Engineers (NCE) might be allowed to provide engineering for projects over \$500,000. The consensus was that it would be okay of NCE submitted proposals, but that decision should be made prior to RFP's being sent out and that all parties would know if NCE was being allowed to submit a proposal. The Council also discussed that when NCE was the engineer that either the Public Works Director or City Administrator sign off as the owner's representative on changer orders and/or pay requests. The Council asked the City Administrator to prepare a policy statement on city engineer services for review at the February 16, 2021 City Council pre-agenda meeting.
- 2. Planning Services: John Mulder reported that we were not planning on contracting with ARDC for ongoing planning services, but only on as an as needed basis. The City has budgeted for another staff position in 2021 to assist with administrative work related to the Road Improvement Plan, MS4 Compliances GIS database management and assisting the Community Development on planning issues. The plan is to have a draft job description for the City Council to review sometime in the second quarter of 2021.
- 3. Legal Services: John Mulder listed some possible pros and cons of either hiring a City Attorney as a staff person or hiring a firm/individual as contracted service. While no specific date has been set, it is a significant issue because of the long term institutional knowledge of the City Attorney. The Council discussed whether to include both prosecution and the City Attorney civil work in any change. The consensus was to leave some options open at this time, but proceed with a draft request for proposal (RFP) for legal services which the Council could review. Based on that, the City could proceed with talking with potential candidates or interested parties. A draft RFP will be prepared for Council to review on March 1st. Any transition plan would have the existing attorney stay on in limited capacity to assist the new attorney.
- **4.** Priority Planning: John Mulder reviewed the results from the planning discussion in January 2019 and the progress made on the issues that had been identified. Council members were then asked what they would like to see accomplished over the next 2-4 years. Following the creation of the list below, each member was asked to vote on their top 4 priorities with 1 being the most important of their

Approve the City sponsoring a grant request to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MNDNR) for the Hermantown Night Riders to purchase snow grooming equipment for the maintenance of their snowmobile trails.

BACKGROUND

In 2020, the Hermantown Night Rider snowmobile club contacted the Park Board requesting the City act as the sponsoring governmental unit for their grant application to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. The application requires a local unit of government be the applicant with an organization or club as a project partner. The Park Board unanimously recommended that the City act as a sponsor for this grant. Unfortunately, the grant was not selected at the time.

The snowmobile club is pursuing this grant opportunity again in 2021. Bart Porter, representing the club, presented his request for support to the Park Board at their January 2021 meeting. The Park Board was in favor of supporting the club with their grant application and is recommending that the City Council approve a resolution supporting the snowmobile club and acting as the grant sponsor.

The snowmobile club is looking to purchase grooming equipment to maintain their 54 miles of snowmobile trails throughout Hermantown, Proctor and Duluth. This new equipment can be used to groom the snowmobile trail and the walking/cross country ski trails in Keene Creek Park. The snowmobile club has groomed these trails in the past.

The City is the grant applicant with the Hermantown Night Riders being a project partner for the grant. The request is for \$35,500 with the 25% required match of \$8,860 provided by the snowmobile club. City staff will coordinate the application with the snowmobile club and administer the grant.

Trail Usage- Walking/Hiking

All the trails are used in all seasons, the snowmobile trail is used by all others in the other seasons. We have people from all parts of Duluth using the trails in the park. Keenes Creek is located of Morris Thomas Rd between Haines road and Stebner Rd. Haines and Stebner are main roads coming out of west Duluth, Lincoln Park, Duluth, Hermantown and Proctor area. This allows a lot of people a quick and easy access to the system with a large easy access parking lot.

The trails are more accessible to all age groups by having a wide groomed trail rather than a single walking trail unmaintained. The work of culverts and bridges across the system have been done the last couple years we did approximately 6 new culverts and two new bridges through the snowmobile club making the system safe and more accessible to all.

Keene Creek Park has a sizeable network of trails throughout the park. Residents from Hermantown, Proctor, and Duluth heavily use this system, drawn by the terrain of rolling hills and the beautiful Keene Creek running through it. The park boasts trails that range from flat and easy, perfect for seniors, to steep trails for the more adventurous. It truly serves the entire community. We are constantly maintaining the trails to keep the trails accessible and free of debris from brush and fallen trees.

The side-by-side will allow us to pull the SnoDozer 600, with walking trail setter, and produce a better trail throughout winter. Year-round trail maintenance would be made easier, faster, and

more efficient by having equipment capable of pulling in trailers to haul off debris and to haul in materials when needed. It will be safer because we will have doors and heat for extreme cold weather. The doors also protect from getting stabbed or stuck with a branch which happens on a snowmobile and ATV from time to time.

Trail Usage- Mountain Biking

Keene Creek Park trail system is used year-round by mountain biking enthusiasts. The terrain found on the trails provides trails for every level of skill and ability. They benefit from the maintenance and grooming of the trials in the same way as those mentioned above.

Trail Usage- Cross Country Skiing

We have cross county skiers that use the trail system. Right now, they use the walking trails, as well as the snowmobile trails. The purchase of the SnoDozer 600 trail groomer, with its cross county trail setters, would enable the grooming of ski trails with a double indented path just for skiers. This would promote the expansion of our cross country ski usage by providing a better trail for them to use. This would provide trails designated for skiers, groomed especially for them. Existing walking trails would remain accessible to them as well. These designated ski trails would provide a safe place for cross country skiers to ski. We have one area that will work great for beginner skiers once we obtain the groomer and trail setter piece for skiing.

Trail Usage-Primary Trail Usage-Snowmobiling

The snowmobile trail has been being used for 50+ years to get to the grant and aid trail. Several years ago, we worked with the city of Hermantown and one private landowner and made it an official snowmobile trail. We started widening it and posting signs to make it safer. It is to small for the big groomers to get down. The new trail separated the snowmobiles to their own primary trail which took them off a long trail shared by all. This trail is privately funded with privately owned equipment. If this private equipment were no longer available, it would be a huge set back for the trail system and accessibility for all that use the system all seasons of the year. This year we reopened and old trail to a look out overlooking all of Duluth this trail also will only fit a side by side. We also just opened a feeder trail from spirit mountain down to the Munger trail and then down to the state trail. This trail can also only be serviced by a side by side. This equipment is key to getting these feeder trails open. It connects trails of all sorts through the Trail system we maintain.

Keenes Creek is a park-and-ride feeder trail to the Grant-in-Aid and state trail systems. Hermantown Night Rider volunteers have been grooming this with privately owned equipment for three years now. It is approx. 1.5 miles just the snowmobile trail in the park. This new trail connects riders to a convenient parking area that is closer to their homes and is large enough to accommodate many vehicles and trailers. This allows people to ride more often because many of the other park-and-rides are small and fill up quickly. This did require residents to trailer their machines across town we are seeing lots of trailers in the park now. We have installed signage throughout the trail system and continue to work on widening the trail, clearing brush off the trail, and leveling the trail where needed. With this new access point and quality of our trails, we are seeing an increase in riders on newer snowmobiles, as well as older sleds being registered and ridden, on our entire trail system because it is so smooth and well maintained. Also, there is a section of trail behind the Tappa Keg Inn restaurant in Duluth that connects the Grant-in-Aid, state trails and the St. Louis riverway. The bridge on that section is too small for the state or club groomers to go over, so it can only be groomed by a side-by-side Minnie groomer. This section is a feeder that connects three different systems. Without this piece of equipment it could not be

groomed to connect them. Our volunteers have been grooming this section using private equipment. Hermantown Night Rider volunteers groom all the trails mentioned in Keene Creek Park, unfunded and with private equipment. We also help groom and maintain 54 miles of GrantinAid trails, and this new equipment will be used to work on the entire trail system. The feeder trails make up another 6 miles of trail. Not to mention allow us to offer even more support to local events, such as the Blackwoods Blizzard Tour, the Vintage Rides, and many resident-organized weekly group rides. The purchase of the Tundra Snow Dozer 600 trail groomer, and the side-by-side to pull it, will allow us to produce an even better trail, much quicker and more efficiently, further increasing trail use. This new equipment will also help us to better pack the snow on the trails in early season, which plays a huge role in the trail quality for the whole season. It will also allow us to groom the trails when there is not enough snow for the large groomers to go out, which will better maintain trail quality between snow accumulations, thus leading to better trail quality all season. This year the private sided by side has been on the entire trail system many times, the trail is flat and the only one in the area that has that accomplished with such small amount of snow. Side by side is a needed to help all the trails.

Snowshoeing

We have large number of snowshoe enthusiasts that use the trail system. From beginner easy flat trails to challenging steeper trails. They benefit from the maintenance and grooming of the trials in the same way as those mentioned above.

Trail Usage-Dog Walking-

We have many dog owners in the area and this is one of the only parks that have trails that welcome dogs. We groom an extra wide entrance to the trail system, providing an area that they can run and play. Many walkers and their pets use this area and the trails daily. Before we groomed this area, most of them walked on a single, narrow, foot carved path that was difficult and sometimes even dangerous for both the owners and their pets. Our groomed trails provide a safer and easier alternative. They benefit from the maintenance and grooming of the trials in the same way as those mentioned above.

Wild Berry and Nut Harvesting

Many people walk on the park trails to pick Service berries, raspberries, strawberries, choke cherries, Mushrooms and hazel nuts. Without the trail system older folks could not access as easy to do these sorts of things.

Bird and animal watching

The park and entire trail system is loaded with grouse, deer, hawks, owls, and many other species. A lot of people take cameras and search these animals out and the topography allows people to get elevated advantages where they can walk up to them often.

The groomer we currently use is pulled behind a volunteer's snowmobile and is homemade and constructed of wood. 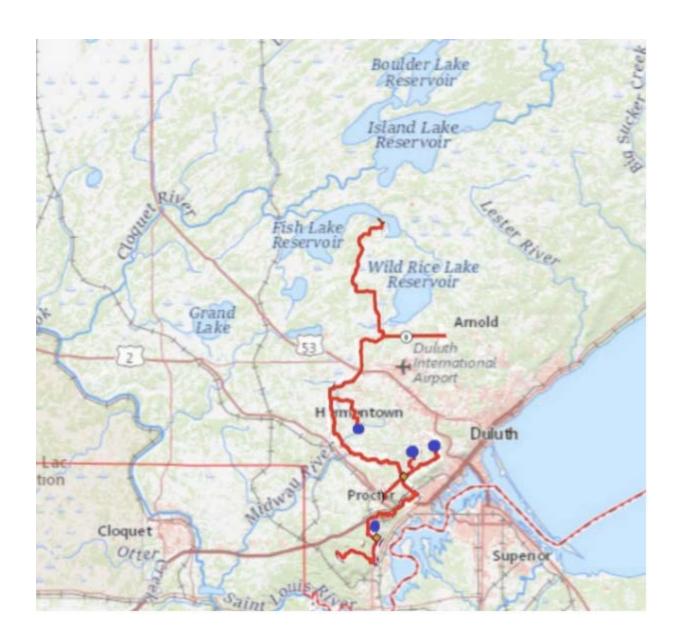

Our club is 89 members strong and growing. The Over the hill Night Riders was formed around 1985 and was renamed the Hermantown Night Riders a few years ago. Since the start we have been responsible for maintaining our equipment, and we have always paid to house our groomers in heated spaces. Our club has a variety of talented members, many of whom are business owners. Their professions range from mechanics, welders, and heavy equipment operators to financial advisors and salespeople. We have active members that have been there since the beginning. We are a very stable, reliable, and self-sufficient club with a strong resume. We have reached the point that we need better equipment, and this grant will enable us to continue providing quality trails to our community. The equipment will be housed inside garages. One at 5186 Martin Road, Duluth, which is situated on a Grant-in-Aid trail. The other is at a Hermantown at 3677 Okerstrom Rd,

Hermantown, which is on the road leading into Keene Creek Park. The equipment will be housed at either location, depending on what part of the trail is being worked on.

This equipment we are using is not large enough to pull the mini groomer; it is designed to be pulled by a side-by-side. We have tried with proper equipment and is much faster and creates a wider and smoother pass. The new equipment has a flashing beacon light, headlights, custom LED lights that illuminates the trail both in front of and behind the machine, interior lights, and brake lights. These all work together to provide clear visibility for both the operator of the groomer, as well as anyone they encounter on the trail. This makes it safer for both the volunteers who are working, as well as all those who are out on the trails. The side-by-side is also equipped with a heated cab with bench seating. This seating allows for more than one volunteer to groom the trail at once. Right now, we have a single volunteer out on their privately owned snowmobile pulling the homemade groomer. This new equipment will provide a safer alternative for all parties involved. This equipment is urgently needed for a few major reasons. 1. Safety. As mentioned, our current methods of grooming leave our volunteers in a somewhat vulnerable state. 2. Privately owned equipment. Right now, we rely heavily on our volunteers to not only donate their time, but their equipment as well. They are required to put their snowmobiles to work and are responsible for upkeep and any repairs their machines may need. It is easy to understand how this could quickly become a problem, especially when using homemade equipment that is repaired regularly. 3. Trail quality and usage. This new equipment will result in better quality trails immediately. The little homemade groomer has maintained as well as it can, but this new groomer will provide a smoother, wider, and all-around better trail. It does not take long for word to get out when the trails are good, and people come out. The equipment will provide trails that people will love to use, and usage will go up. The benefit compared to cost. This new machine can do things the big groomer can't. It can access smaller trails, like the Keene Creek Park feeder trail, as well as walking trails. It uses less fuel than the large groomer and will be more cost effective to maintain. It can also groom the trails when there is less snow, which will better maintain trail quality between snow accumulations, as well as at the beginning and end of the snowmobiling season when snow is scarce, thus leading to better trail quality all season. The applicant purchased the property located at 486x Hermantown Road for the purposes of constructing a single family home and associated driveway.

Development Details

The applicant purchased this property in the fall of 2020. He has had discussions with the MN DNR regarding the unmapped tributary located on the property. The applicant is proposing for a driveway located on the eastern portion of the property that would extend approximately 375 feet into the property in order to access upland area located on the property.

The driveway is located as to minimize the wetland impacts but will necessitate a crossing of the unmapped tributary. The proposed 52' x 68' house footprint is proposed to be a minimum of 150' away from the Ordinary High Water Level (OHWL) which meets the structure setback requirements of a Natural Environment Shoreland area.

A public hearing was held on January 21, 2021 to discuss the application. There were three residents in attendance for the meeting. The Planning Commission recommended the project to the City Council for their review and approval.

Wetlands

The applicant will need to engage a wetland delineator in order to document the extent of the wetlands and submit for approval of wetland impacts. 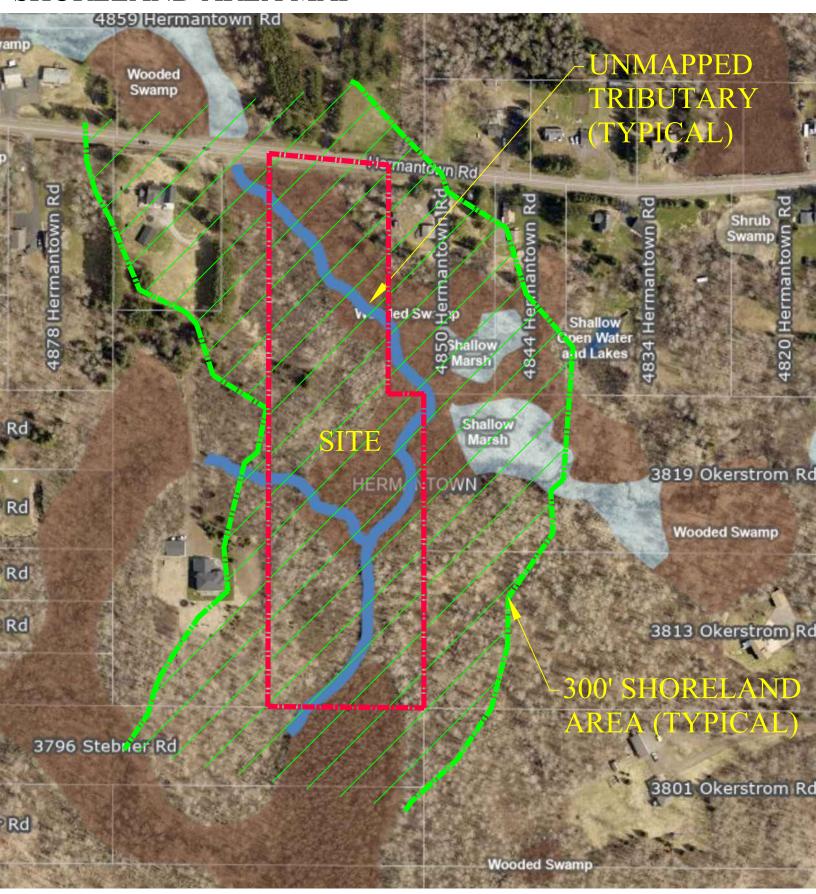

This bridge is on a state aid roadway and therefore needs to be designed to state standards. The current standards require a larger span and to flatten the in-slopes which requires filling within the shoreland area as part of the construction. BACKGROUND

As part of our 2021 Capital improvement plan, we have a plan for a 6 year Municipal lease with a \$2.00 Purchase option at the end of the lease terms. We will be trading our existing motor grader off due to excessive maintenance, (over \$87,000) in the last 4.5 years. There was the fear that this major part of our snowplowing operation will break during a crucial snowfall and we would be left without a motor grader for parts of the snow plow season. We have chosen the lease option because it gives us the flexibility of purchasing it at the end of the lease or return it and lease a newer machine. Motor graders are meant to be run on gravel roads and grade gravel. Snowplowing is a secondary function that they serve and take much more abuse by doing so. By going to a lease, we minimize our capital outlay and are able to eliminate big balloon payments. The council approved the contract for the motor grader by Resolution on October 19, 2020. (Res. 2020-142)

In going to a lease, we have an existing motor grader that we will need to remove from the City fleet. We have worked with McCoy Construction to trade the City's existing motor grader for a new frontend loader with snow equipment to our fleet of equipment.

This is a purchase through McCoy Construction & Forestry as part of the MN State Bid Process.
