To Whom It May Concern;

As a resident of the city of Hermantown, who currently resides at 4725 Swan Lake Rd and is one of the property owners being assessed for recent road improvements to that portion of Swan Lake Rd that is now a city street, I would like to state my reasons for objecting to that assessment here:

1. Only a portion of that short stretch of Swan Lake Rd, (roughly ½), was changed from a county road to a city street. Why only part of a road that is hardly a mile long in its entirety?

 The last time this section of Swan Lake Rd was resurfaced was in 1999. Plans were already in the works by 2019 to resurface it again. The 22 year lifespen since the last major work on this road was completed saw traffic volumes increase from 501 vehicles/day in 1999 to 1400 vehicles/day in 2019, an almost threefold increase.

3. The vehicle/day count is sure to increase at an even faster rate with the opening of the new Costco store as this "short cut" through Swan Lake Rd will be used by many to avoid the traffic

delays at the Arrowhead and Haines road intersection.

4. With the ever increasing volumes of traffic, a significant number of which are medium to heavy duty trucks, it is not inconceivable to imagine that this road will require resurfacing again in less than the 22 years between the last two resurfacing projects. The assessments to the four property owners on this section of Swan Lake Rd for the next resurfacing project would very possibly start soon after this 15 year assessment ended, making the assessment payments nearly perpetual. As a side note: there a five landowners on the city street portion of Swan Lake Rd, however, one is the city of Hermantown which is not part of the assessment process.

As I have stated at previous meetings, I don't understand why the city of Hermantown would agree to changing a county road with three residences in total on it and with that type of traffic volume into a city street. Not only have you subjected the four landowners on this section of road with subsidizing its use by a large volume of vehicles that are just passing through, but you have caused a much larger expense for all Hermantown residents who now had to pay for the balance of the road work and the bridge replacement over Miller Creek. This road should have remained a county road so that those expenses could have been spread out more equitably to all those who use it!

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN

COUNTY OF ST. LOUIS AND CITY OF HERMANTOWN

THIS AGREEMENT, hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement," is made and entered into between the COUNTY OF ST. LOUIS, a body politic and corporate existing under the laws of the State of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as "St. Louis County", and the CITY OF HERMANTOWN, a body politic and corporate existing under the laws of the State of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as "Hermantown".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, St. Louis County has prepared a maintenance striping project to maintain pavement markings on its county highways, identified further as CP 0000-369670; and

WHEREAS, Hermantown has requested to participate in this maintenance striping project to maintain pavement markings on their city streets; and

WHEREAS, St. Louis County has approved Hermantown to participate in this maintenance striping project, which work hereafter will be referred to as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, St. Louis County and Hermantown have each determined the locations, quantities and types of pavement markings on their respective highways and streets; and

WHEREAS, St. Louis County and Hermantown have agreed to participate in the Project costs as hereinafter set forth.

THEREFORE, with regard to the Project, the parties hereby agree to the following:

- St. Louis County shall prepare the plan, specifications, proposal and engineer's estimate for said Project in accordance with the 2020 Edition of the Minnesota Department of Transportation "Standard Specifications for Construction".
- Hermantown shall provide to St. Louis County with the required locations, quantities and types of pavement markings that will be placed within Hermantown. St. Louis County shall incorporate said information into the plan and proposal.

- 3. St. Louis County shall open bids for the Project. Hermantown shall promptly review the apparent low bid and notify St. Louis County if it approves. St. Louis County, acting through the St. Louis County Highway Engineer, shall award the contract for said Project to the lowest responsible bidder in accordance with current Minnesota Statutes.
- 4. St. Louis County shall perform all necessary contract administration, and shall administer the terms of the contract from contract award to the certification of final payment. Hermantown shall pay to St. Louis County a flat fee in the amount of \$300.00 for contract administration services rendered by St. Louis County to Hermantown under this Agreement.
- St. Louis County shall perform all record keeping and construction inspection for quantities associated with St. Louis County's portion of the Project in accordance with the plan and proposal.
- Hermantown shall perform all record keeping and construction inspection for quantities
 associated with Hermantown's portion of the Project in accordance with the plan and
 proposal, and shall report any observed deficiencies or discrepancies to St. Louis
 County immediately.
- 7. St. Louis County's cost participation shall be 100 percent of St. Louis County's quantities as provided in the plan and proposal at the contract unit prices. St. Louis County shall also be responsible for 100 percent of the cost of overrun in St. Louis County's quantities or change orders applied to St. Louis County.
- 8. Hermantown's cost participation shall be 100 percent of Hermantown's quantities as provided in the plan and proposal at the contract unit prices. Hermantown shall also be responsible for 100 percent of the cost of overrun in Hermantown's quantities or change orders applied to Hermantown. Hermantown shall approve any change orders in writing.
- Hermantown shall pay to St. Louis County upon award of the contract 95 percent of Hermantown's obligation as contained in the awarded contractor's bid, within 35 days of receipt of an invoice from St. Louis County.
- 10. Upon completion of the Project, Hermantown shall pay to St. Louis County the remaining balance of Hermantown's obligation of the Project, plus the contract administration fee, within 35 days of receipt of an invoice from St. Louis County. If any funds are received by St. Louis County in excess of the Project and administrative costs, they will be returned to Hermantown without Interest.
- 11. St. Louis County shall require all contractors and subcontractors performing work for said Project to name Hermantown as an insured party in the amounts listed in the Insurance requirements contained in the contract.

- 12. To the full extent permitted by law, actions by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement are intended to be and shall be construed as a "cooperative activity" and it is the intent of the Parties that they shall be deemed a "single governmental unit" for the purpose of liability, as set forth in Minnesota Statutes, Section 471,59, Subd. 1a.
- 13. Each party shall be liable for its own acts to the extent provided by law, and each party hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the others, their officers and employees against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, expenses, claims or actions, including attorney's fees, which the others, their officers and employees may hereafter sustain, incur or be required to pay, arising out of or by reason of any act of omission of the party, its agents, servants or employees, in the execution, performance, or failure to adequately perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. Any and all employees of Hermantown, while engaged in the performance of any work or service which Hermantown is specifically required to perform under this Agreement, shall be considered employees of Hermantown only and not of St. Louis County. Any and all claims that may or might arise under the Workers Compensation Act of the State of Minnesota on behalf of said employees while so engaged and any and all claims made by any third parties as a consequence of any act of said employees shall be the sole obligation of Hermantown.
- 15. Any and all employees of St. Louis County, while engaged in the performance of any work or service which St. Louis County is specifically required to perform under this Agreement, shall be considered employees of St. Louis County only and not of Hermantown. Any and all claims that may or might arise under the Workers Compensation Act of the State of Minnesota on behalf of said employees while so engaged and any and all claims made by any third parties as a consequence of any act, of said employees, shall be the sole obligation of St. Louis County.
- 16. Each party designates an authorized representative for the purpose of administering this Agreement. A party's authorized representative has the authority to give and receive notices, and to make any other decision required or permitted by this Agreement.

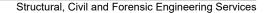

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Staff recommends approval of the utility extension agreement with A-LIGN Properties LLC in order to install water and sanitary sewer mains along Lavaque Road.

DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST:

A-LIGN Properties LLC (applicant) was approved by the City Council in March 2021 to construct three twinhomes (6 units total) on an existing 4.1 acre lot with the property being subdivided into three parcels ranging in size from 1.24 to 1.61 acres in size. The building locations are situated as to utilize an existing upland portion of the property on which to build.

The applicant will connect each residential unit to City sewer and water systems. Water and sewer are available along Hermantown Road with these two buildings having an availability fee associated with them. The twinhome building fronting Lavaque Road will require the extension of public sewer and water approximately 270 feet to the north from Hermantown Road.

To date, the two twinhomes along Hermantown Road have been constructed and are nearing completion. The third twinhome along Lavaque Road is planned in the near future but requires the extension of water and sanitary mains in order to be built.

The applicant has provided engineered plans for utility extensions/connections for the proposed work. Detailed plans for the utility extensions/connections will be reviewed and approved by the City Engineer prior to issuance of the building permits. The utility work will be designed and built to City standards/specifications and turned over to the City upon recommendation of acceptance by the City Engineer.

The applicant is proposing to provide individual utility services to each unit as this allows for the potential sale of the units.

There is an existing utility easement running from Hermantown Road to the property located at 3810 Lavaque Road. The location of the townhome building and proposed driveway on Tract B do not conflict with this easement.

The applicant will be required to either present a Letter of Credit for 125% of the construction value of these utilities or install these utilities prior to obtaining a certificate of occupancy.

The request for a utility extension along Lavaque Road was reviewed by the Utility Commission on October 19, 2021. Their only comment was the requirement to extend the utilities along the full length of

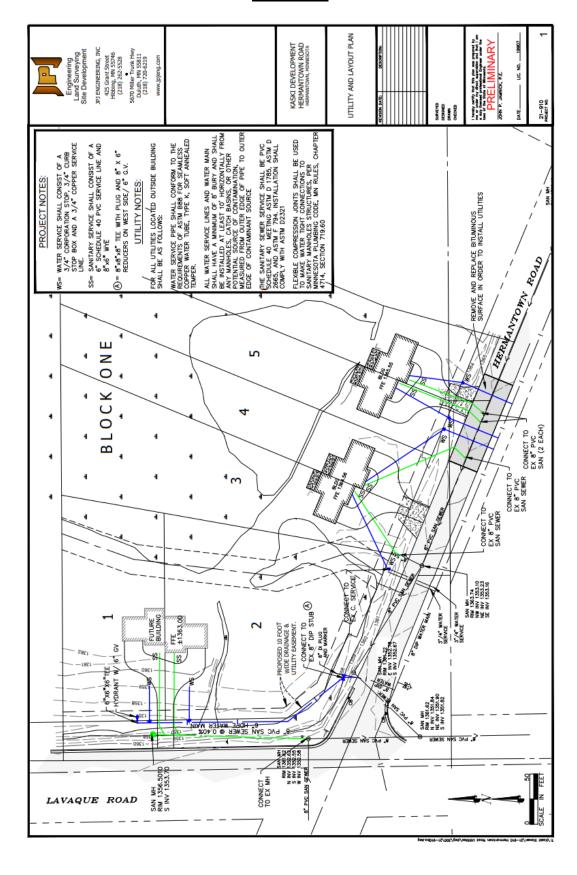

UTILITY SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS UTILITY SERVICE AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 2021, between the **City of Hermantown**, a municipal corporation (hereinafter called "City"), and **A-LIGN Properties LLC**, a Minnesota Limited Liability Company ("Owner"), is made in response to the following situation:

- A. Owner is the owner of real estate ("Property") situated in St. Louis County, Minnesota, legally described on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto.
- B. Owner desires to construct privately a public sanitary sewer and public water lines by way of the existing sanitary sewer and water lines in the Hermantown Road right of way.
- C. The location of the extended utilities and the proposed service lines to provide service to the proposed twin homes on the Property is shown on <u>Exhibit B</u> attached hereto.
- D. City has approved a planned unit development to construct three, two-family dwellings on the Property, and agreed to allow Owner to obtain sanitary sewer and water service to the Property under the terms and conditions specified herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. As proposed on Exhibit B, Owner will extend the utility lines from the existing connection into its site along the Lavaque Road public right of way.
- 2. Owner will obtain all necessary permits for the utility extensions, including a Minnesota Department of Health permit for the water main and WLSSD and MPCA permits for the sanitary sewer extension.
- 3. Owner will be responsible for any road repairs associated with the utility work described herein.
- 4. Owner will provide engineering plans for the sewer and water main extensions and for the utility connections to the twin homes prior to beginning such utility work. The City Engineer shall review and must approved Owner's utility plans prior to utility construction.
- 5. Owner shall pay to the City's utility department the sewer hook up fee & permit fee per the City's Fee Schedule, as well as a WLSSD Capacity Availability Fee of \$940.00 for each connection. The amount required to be paid under this Agreement shall be paid in full upon execution of this Agreement by the Owner.
- 6. Owner shall pay to the City's utility department the water hook up fee per the City's Fee Schedule, as well as a water availability charge of \$7.50 per front foot of road frontage for

each connection. The amount required to be paid under this Agreement shall be paid in full upon execution of this Agreement by the Owner.

- 7. Owner shall provide a security deposit equal to 125% of cost of construction of the utility improvements at time of Agreement execution. The security is to be in effect until all of the utility improvements have been constructed and the City Engineer and City Public Works Director executes a Certificate of Completion with respect to the utility improvements attesting that they have been properly constructed. No building permits shall be granted for the Property until the Certificate of Completion is issued.
- 8. In consideration of the payment of such sums and the performance of all of the other obligations of Owner to City hereunder, City hereby grants to Owner the right to extend the sanitary sewer main and water main to connect to the Property.
- 9. Owner covenants and agrees to execute a petition in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C for the extension of the City sanitary sewer main and water main adjacent to the Property along Hermantown Road and that confirms Owner's obligation to pay for the cost of the extension of the sanitary sewer main and water main.
- 10. Owner shall be responsible for, indemnify and hold harmless the City from paying for all costs and expenses in connection with the installation, construction of the sanitary sewer main and water main extension. City shall be entitled to repair the sanitary sewer main or water main at the expense of Owner if Owner fails to repair the sanitary sewer main or water main. Any costs and expenses incurred by the City in connection with any such repair of the sanitary sewer main or water main shall be paid by Owner to the City immediately upon receipt by Owner of an itemized statement for the cost and expense incurred by the City in repairing the sanitary sewer main or water main. If Owner fails to pay such amount to the City within thirty (30) days of the mailing of such itemized statement by the City to Owner, then the City may proceed to collect such amount from Owner in whatever manner it deems appropriate, including, without limitation, assessing the amount of such statement against the Property in the manner provided by law. In this regard, Owner agrees that any charge made by the City for the repair of the sanitary sewer main shall be a charge for sanitary sewer service and any charges made by the City for the repair of the water main shall be a charge for water service. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to require the City to repair the sanitary sewer main or water main. Owner acknowledges that if Owner fails to repair the sanitary sewer main or water main, that City may discontinue allowing Owner to have access to the sanitary sewer main or water main. Owner hereby grants City permission to test the sanitary sewer main for leaks at any time and Owner agrees to pay the cost of performing any such test (i) once per calendar year or (ii) if the test shows that the sanitary sewer main is leaking.
- 11. Owner shall pay all legal fees and other expenses and any engineering fees and expenses incurred by the City of Hermantown in connection with the preparation of the Agreement and the documents related to this Agreement. A failure by Owner to pay such fees and expenses shall entitle City to discontinue providing water service to Owner until such fees and expenses are paid. Such fees and expenses shall also be deemed to be a charge for sewer or water service.

- 12. Owner shall complete a standard form of City's Sanitary Sewer Application prior to making any connection to the sanitary sewer main.
- 13. Owner shall complete a standard form of the City's Water Service Application prior to making any connection to the water main.
- 14. Owner agrees to notify the City at least three (3) working days before Owner commences the construction of the sanitary sewer main extension or water main extension and does further agree that no connection shall be made by Owner to the sanitary sewer main or water main until such connection, including the location of such connection, is approved and, if applicable, made by the City Public Works Director.
- Owner agrees that the sanitary sewer main extension and water main extension shall 15. be built and installed in accordance with all applicable building, plumbing and other codes and regulations and in accordance with the policies, requirements and procedures of the Utility Commission of the City including the installation of required clean-outs, if applicable. The City shall be entitled to inspect the Utility Service at any time during the construction and installation of it. A drawing showing the location of the Utility Service, which must show that it is within the City Right of Way, a design for installation of the Utility Service shall be prepared by a Minnesota registered engineer and submitted to the City Public Works Director and City Engineer for their review and written approval which shall be noted on the design and drawing. No changes in the design of the sanitary sewer main or water main shall be made without the prior written approval of the City Public Works Director and City Engineer. An "as built" record drawing showing the location and depth of the sanitary sewer main and water main and a collateral assignment of any warranties related to the construction and installation of the sanitary sewer main and water main, including any covering the pipe utilized in such installation, of the shall be provided to the City within ten (10) days after the completion of the installation of the sanitary sewer main and water main. If such "as built" record drawing is not provided within such time then, in that event, the City shall be entitled to discontinue sanitary sewer service and water service to the Property until such drawing is provided.
- 16. Owner agrees to not conduct any on-site burning or burial of brush or other site debris on the Property.

Map Showing Location of Existing Sanitary Sewermain And Watermain and Proposed Location of Sanitary Sewer and Water Service Lines

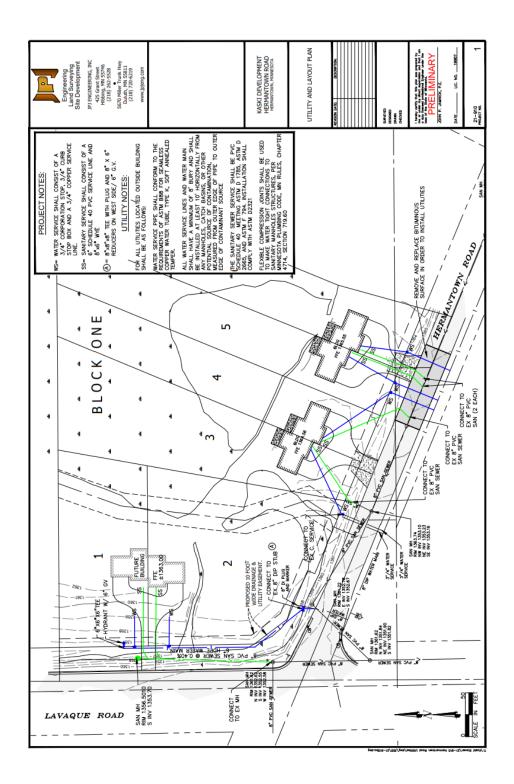

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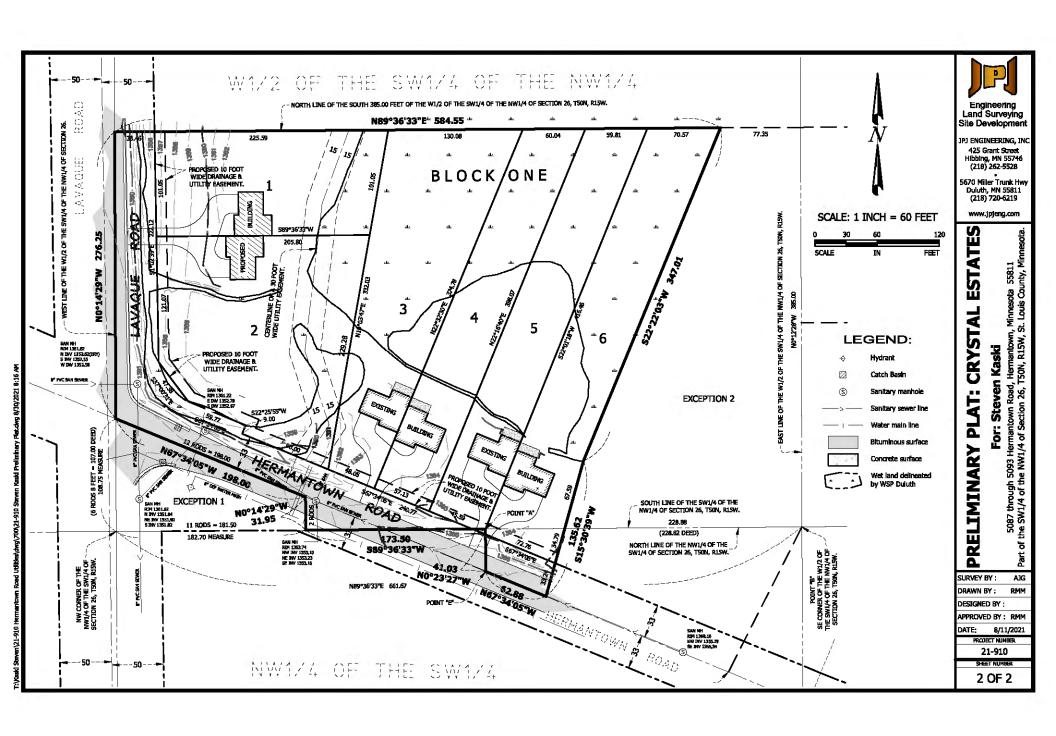
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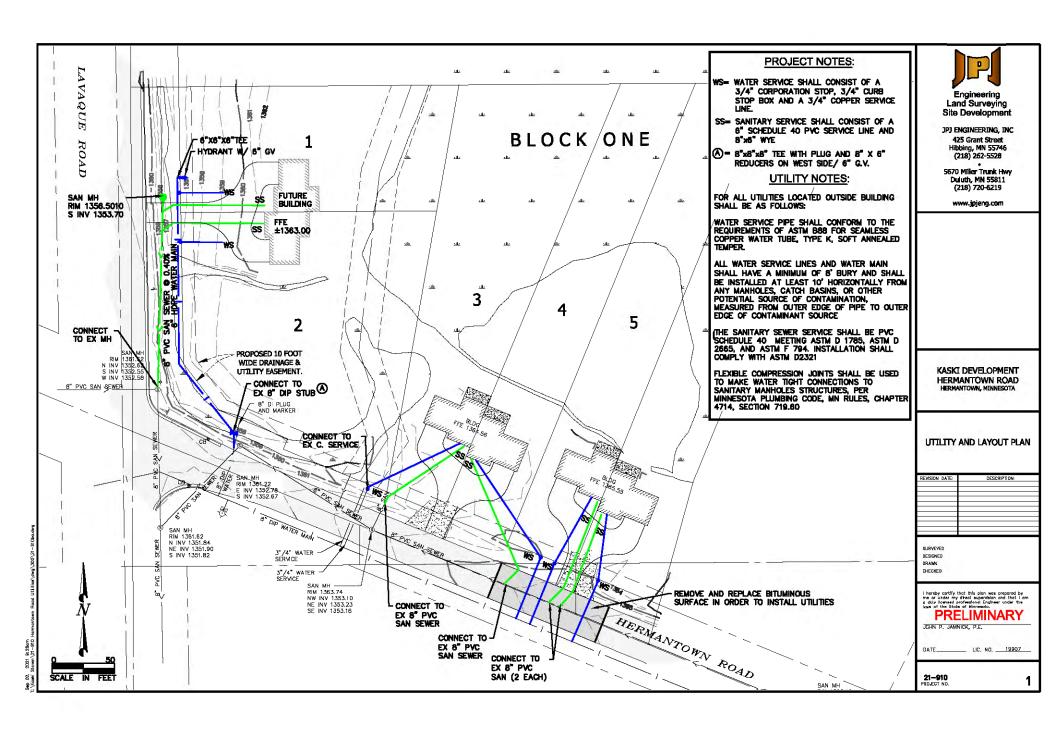

Approve the creation of a grant program for irrigation meters for 2022

BACKGROUND

In 2020, there were a couple of complaints by residents that they had to pay sewer charges when they were watering their lawn. The City has allowed residents to install a second meter for irrigation purposes in the past at their expense. Those meters can cost between \$300 and \$500 dollars. The residents are then required to have a licensed plumber install them.

The Mayor specifically asked staff to find a way to assist residents in avoiding sewer charges for watering lawns. The attached grant program would provide irrigation meters to up to 5 people on a first come, first served basis in 2022. The approximate cost of the program would be \$1,500 to \$2,500.

If approved we would notify water customers shortly after the new year.

RESOLUTION CREATING A GRANT PROGRAM FOR CURRENT UTILITY CUSTOMERS IN 2022

WHEREAS, the City of Hermantown provides water and sewer services for utility customers; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the public interest to provide a grant program to five (5) utility customers in 2022 for watering without incurring sewer charges; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hermantown is creating a grant program to provide irrigation meters for five (5) utility customers in 2022; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Hermantown to provide irrigation meters to five (5) utility customers as follows:

- 1. The grant shall come in the form of an irrigation meter free of charge.
- 2. The utility customer shall be a water and sewer customer of the City of Hermantown and one of the first five (5) utility customers to request an irrigation meter.
- 3. The utility customer shall install the irrigation meter within 60 days of receiving the irrigation meter and bear the cost of installation from an approved licensed contractor through the City. If the utility customer does not have the irrigation meter installed within 60 days, they shall return the meter to the City.
- 4. The utility customer shall have the installation of the meter inspected by the City of Hermantown Public Works Dept.

CITY OF HERMANTOWN IRRIGATION METERS GRANT PROGRAM POLICY

This Grant Program Policy applies to all applications for irrigation meters.

1) Program Overview

The City of Hermantown ("City") will provide irrigation water meters to up to five (5) residential homeowners in 2022. The purpose of the Grant Program is to mitigate the instances where irrigation water customers are being charged for water being put into the public sewer system that does not in fact go into the public sewer system. The City has recently updated the Ordinance governing irrigation meters and wants to encourage their use. An irrigation meter otherwise costs around Five Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$500.00).

2) Eligible Applicants

Eligible applicants are residents of Hermantown and owners of a residential home with a yard or garden that is or will be serviced by City water and sewer. Eligible applicants must be current on their water and sewer accounts.

3) Grant Criteria

Up to five (5) eligible applicants in 2022 will receive the grant of an irrigation meter. Each Grant Application will be reviewed and evaluated on a first-come-first serve basis.

4) Grant Terms

A completed Grant Application will be submitted to the City Finance Department. The City will provide the irrigation meter to the grantee at no cost. The grantee is required to have the meter installed at his or her own cost. The meter must be installed in the residence within sixty (60) days by a licensed plumber and shall meet all requirements set forth in Hermantown City Code § 940.20.6 and all other applicable local, state and federal requirements. The grantee shall provide the City Finance Department proof of installation within a week after said installation.

5) Grant Evaluation and Process

All Grant Applications shall be evaluated and processed by the City Finance Department. Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria and grant terms.

6) Grant Application

Grant Applications are available through the City's Finance Department. Grant Applications will be accepted until the available irrigation meters have been expended.
